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
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FORT BUCHANAN MAP

School Liaison Officer (SLO)

School Liaison Officers (SLOs) serve as the bridge between installations and school communities, providing families with trusted support in all areas of education. They work with public, private, and homeschool communities to ensure every student has the resources they need to thrive.

Programs offered through School Support Services include:

- Youth Sponsorship – helping new students feel welcome
- Parent Education Workshops – empowering families with tools for success
- Educator Workshops – strengthening school staff understanding of military life
- Homeschool Support – resources and connections for home educators
- Adopt-A-School – building lasting partnerships between installations and schools

SUPPORT

Five Components of School Support Services

Transition and Deployment Support

- Assists families by connecting them to their next duty station
- Facilitates communication between the school/installation leadership and the parent
- Provides detailed information on school and local education policies
- Provides direct contacts for school and installation support for special education information
- Connect youth to youth sponsors

Homeschool Connection

- Provides information about local and state homeschool policies
- Connects homeschool families to homeschool groups
- Assists with access to physical education, art, and other auxiliary programs

Installation/School Communication

- Informs command on school and youth education issues
- Reports information where command action is required
- Coordinates with local school systems to facilitate education support services and transitions
- Attends School Meetings
- Disseminates information

Partnerships in Education

- Initiatives will be different in each community as they are based on community need
- Builds relationships to ensure student success

Post Secondary Opportunities

Youth Sponsorship Program Request a Youth Sponsor Today!

For Students

The Youth Sponsorship Program connects students who are new to the community with students who already live here—a friendly face who already knows the ropes and is excited to show you around. It's all about making sure you feel welcome and confident as you start this new chapter.

Here's what your sponsor can do for you:

- **Show You Around:** Get a personal tour of the school and CYS facilities so you know where everything is.
- **Answer Your Questions:** Ask them anything! From "What's for lunch?" to "What do kids do for fun around here?"—no question is too small.
- **Introduce You to New People:** Your sponsor will help you meet other students and make new friends.
- **Be Your "Lunch" Buddy:** They can eat with you so you don't have to sit alone.
- **Invite You to Fun Events:** Your sponsor will invite you to join in on cool activities and even attend them with you.
- **Be a Source of Support:** Moving can be tough. Your sponsor is there to provide encouragement and support when you need it.

For Parents

We know that a successful move is about more than just unpacking boxes. The Youth Sponsorship Program is designed to support your child's social and emotional well-being during this important transition.

A peer mentor provides a unique kind of support that helps new students feel like they belong right away.

- **Reduces "New Kid" Stress and Anxiety:** By connecting with a peer, your child gets a youth's perspective on their new life, which helps reduce the natural worries that come with being new. This allows you to focus on the logistics of the move, knowing your child is already making friends.
- **Builds Confidence and a Sense of Belonging:** Having a sponsor gives your child a go-to person for questions and introductions. This fosters a sense of belonging and helps them feel more confident and engaged in their new school and community from day one.
- **A Connection for Every Age:** We have sponsors available for all school-age children, ensuring that your child will be matched with a peer who understands their specific environment.

Ready to Get Connected

Getting a sponsor for your child is easy! Once you receive PCS orders, reach out to the School Liaison Officer at your current installation. The SLO will get you all the information you need to get started.

EFMP Exceptional Family Member Program

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) provides support to military families who have a child or adult family member with special needs. It connects families to medical, educational, and community resources to ensure their needs are considered during assignments and while stationed at Fort Buchanan.

Who is Eligible?

Family members (children or adults) with physical, emotional, developmental, or intellectual conditions requiring specialized care, such as:

- Autism, developmental delays, ADHD/ADD
- Asthma, diabetes, heart conditions
- Cancer or other chronic medical needs
- Emotional or behavioral health needs

Why EFMP Matters?

- Ensures family needs are considered during assignment decisions (especially OCONUS).
- Provides access to coordinated medical, educational, and community services.
- Helps families navigate transitions and avoid gaps in care.
- Enrollment does not affect promotions or career progression.

SUPPORTING MILITARY FAMILIES WITH SPECIAL MEDICAL AND EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

SPECIAL MEDICAL NEEDS

You should enroll in EFMP if you have a:



- Who requires special medical services for a chronic condition
- Who receives ongoing services from a medical specialist
- Who has significant behavioral health concerns

SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS

You should enroll in EFMP if you have a:



- Who receives special education services through an Individualized Education Program
- Who receives special medical services
- Who receives early intervention through an Individualized Family Service Plan
- Or is eligible for these services

Specific criteria can be found in DoD Instruction 1315.19

THE EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM HAS MORE THAN JUST ONE CONNECTION POINT FOR FAMILIES.
THE PROGRAM HAS THREE SEPARATE COMPONENTS: IDENTIFICATION & ENROLLMENT, ASSIGNMENT COORDINATION AND FAMILY SUPPORT.



Enrollment in the EFMP is mandatory for active duty military members. When a family member is identified with special medical and/or educational needs, the special needs are documented through enrollment in the EFMP. Medical services work with families to coordinate identification and enrollment in EFMP.

Medical and military personnel departments work with military members and families to coordinate assignments. While the military mission is the driving force, enrollment in EFMP ensures that a family member's special medical and/or educational needs are considered, since appropriate services may be limited in some locations.

EFMP Family Support plays a critical role in helping families navigate the Identification and Enrollment and Assignment Coordination processes. They also connect families with resources and support – helping them to become their own best advocate – with services including:

- Information and referral for military support providers and community services
- Education and outreach
- Referral to other Military and Family Support Warm handoffs to the EFMP at the next location
- Non-clinical case management

WHY ENROLL?

Enrollment ensures that the family member's documented medical and/or educational needs are considered during the assignment process. EFMP enrollment is required before you may enroll in TRICARE ECHO.

Enrollment is mandatory for Soldiers with family members who have qualifying needs.

Who Must Enroll?

- Active Duty Army Soldiers
- Army Reserve Soldiers in the Active Guard Reserve (AGR)
- Army National Guard AGR personnel (Title 10 or 32 USC)

The Military and Family Life Counseling Program helps military families and children navigate challenges with free face-to-face support.

Child and youth behavioral military and family life counselors, or CYB-MFLCs, provide confidential non-medical counseling services to children and youth up to age 18 in groups and individually. They also offer support to families, staff and support personnel. Working with a counselor can help improve behavior, performance in school and relationships.

CYB-MFLCs are master's or doctorate-level licensed counselors who may:

- Provide consultation support to parents and caregivers, childcare providers, teachers and administrators on the healthy development of children and youth
- Model evidence-based intervention approaches
- Assist educators with strategies for cultivating a deeper understanding of the factors that shape social-emotional development
- Conduct classroom observations


Services are private and confidential except in situations that involve domestic violence, child abuse, sexual assault or otherwise necessitate a duty to warn.

Registration Process - Eligibility and Enrollment

Registering for a DoDEA School using DSIS

DoDEA Student Information System (DSIS) online registration is currently available for families registering in schools serviced by Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA). DSIS online registration reduces manual forms and makes it easy for parents to register their child for school.

DoDEA parents are also required to annually re-register their student(s). Schools will notify parents when it is time to re-register their students. During this process, parents will be able to update contact information, update Sponsor's employment status, and indicate whether their student will return for the upcoming school year.

Universal Prekindergarten: As a condition of enrollment, all universal prekindergarten students are required to participate in the Student Meal Program, and sponsors are responsible for any daily costs associated with meals. (This does not apply to Sure Start, half-day prekindergarten, and preschool students receiving special education services who are not enrolled in universal prekindergarten.)

DoDEA recommends completing the online registration process using a desktop or laptop computer. The online registration process may not work on a mobile device.

Login to Family Portal®

The official website for DoDEA's student registration and school communication is the DoDEA Student Information System (DSIS) at <https://dodeasis.myfollett.com/aspn/logon.do>. At present, DoDEA is not associated with any other third-party vendors or applications for these services.

If you already have a DoDEA Family Portal Account.

- Click on the Login to Family Portal button
- Log in with your username & password.
- Once logged in, read the Announcement to get started.
- Click the initiate button in the "New Student Registration" box to complete the DoDEA registration process.

If you **Do Not** have a DoDEA Family Portal Account.

- Click on the Login to Family Portal button.
- Click "Request an account" ONLY if you are registering a student(s) in DoDEA. If you have students currently in DoDEA, you already have a DoDEA Family Portal account.
- Select "I am a parent/guardian registering my child online".
- Follow the prompts to complete account setup.
- Log in and read the Announcement to get started.



DoDEA Registration Process

What you need to know about school registration

To enroll your child in a DoDEA school, the following age requirements must be met by September 1 of the school year:

- Universal Prekindergarten: Child must be 4 years old
- Kindergarten: Child must be 5 years old
- First Grade: Child must be 6 years old



Preschool Services for Children with Disabilities (PSCD)

Preschool Services for Children with Disabilities (PSCD) offers eligible young children with disabilities specially designed instruction, support, and services to meet their identified individualized learning needs.

Enrollment Eligibility

PSCD is available to children starting at age three who show developmental delays or have a diagnosed disability.

Eligibility is determined through a comprehensive evaluation process involving standardized tools, observations, and professional judgment of early intervention or related services professionals.

3-year-olds attend a half-day program in a separate classroom.

4-year-olds participate in a full-day program integrated into the Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) classroom.

DoDEA does not offer programs for three-year-olds outside of PSCD.



Worried your infant or toddler may be experiencing developmental delays? If you're concerned about your child's behavior, motor skills, or overall development, you can request EDIS services directly, no pediatrician referral needed.

EDIS provides free early intervention services for children (0-36 months) living in Puerto Rico and eligible to attend DoDEA-PR schools at Fort Buchanan or Ramey under the Space-Required-Tuition-free category.

The EDIS team is comprised of an Early Childhood Special Educator, Pediatric Occupational Therapist and a Pediatric Speech and Language Pathologist. Services are delivered in the child's natural environment at no direct cost to the family.

Early Intervention Services:

- Developmental screenings and assessments.
- Family training, counseling, and home visits.
- Education to day care and home care providers.
- Assistive technology devices and services.
- Service Coordination.

Puerto Rico Weather & Climate What You Need to Know

Puerto Rico's tropical climate brings warmth year-round, but families new to the island should be prepared for seasonal changes and occasional weather-related emergencies. **A good tip is to keep a lightweight raincoat, poncho, or small umbrella in your child's backpack to be ready for sudden showers.**

Seasons & Regional Differences

- Dry Season (Dec–Apr): Sunny skies, lower humidity, and ideal beach weather.
- Rainy Season (May–Nov): Afternoon showers are common, especially in the north and mountains. This overlaps with Atlantic hurricane season (Jun–Nov).
- North vs. South: The north coast is wetter due to trade winds, while the south coast is semi-arid and sunnier.
- Mountains: Cooler temperatures (around 61–70°F) and frequent showers.

What to Expect

- Temperatures: 70–90°F (21–32°C) in lower elevations; cooler in the central mountains.
- Humidity: High year-round, averaging 74–81% depending on season.
- Rainfall: Tropical cyclones contribute about a quarter of annual rainfall.

Flash Floods & Emergencies

- Heavy Rain Risk: Intense downpours can cause flash floods, landslides, and mudslides, especially in mountainous and flood-prone areas.
- Preparedness:
 - Stay alert to National Weather Service San Juan advisories.
 - Avoid driving through flooded roads—water can rise quickly and be dangerous.

ACUEDUCTOS



Water service is provided by Autoridad de Acueductos y Alcantarillados. To start your water, you must first create an account on the [Mi Acueductos](#) online portal. A security deposit is required.

Required information and documents

- Full Name, Phone Number, Social Security Number
- Valid ID (Driver's License or Passport)
- Postal and Physical Address
- Lease Agreement (if renting) or Purchase Agreement (if owning)
- Existing account or meter number (if available)
- For residences that are new or have been unoccupied for more than a year, you must also provide a licensed Master Plumber Certification.

Application Process

1. Complete the online form and upload the required documents. You will receive a service order number.
2. The evaluation results will be sent to you via email. You can also check the status of your order in the 'Estatus de Orden' section of the portal.
3. If you do not receive a response within 3 business days, please contact the Customer Service Center at 787-620-2482.





VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND TOLL SYSTEM

In Puerto Rico, a single electronic sticker on your vehicle's windshield serves two main purposes: it is your annual vehicle registration (Marbete Digital) and your pre-paid toll pass (AutoExpreso).

Vehicle registration

To get or renew your vehicle registration you must complete the following steps:

1. Vehicle must be inspected yearly. This applies to cars over two years old and can be done at any authorized shop, including the Auto/Hobby Shop on post.
2. Carry liability insurance. You can either use a private insurer or purchase the compulsory government-issued insurance during the renewal process.
3. Pay the ACAA (Automobile Accident Compensation Administration) mandatory medical/disability insurance (normally \$35/year) and the vehicle registration fee (normally \$25).
4. Ensure you have no outstanding traffic or toll fines.

The renewal can be done easily through the CESCO Digital mobile app or in person at authorized locations like inspection centers or banks.

AutoExpreso Toll System

This same sticker is used for the AutoExpreso toll system. For it to work, you must load funds onto your account. Since most major highways are completely cashless, it is essential to keep your AutoExpreso account funded to travel around the island and avoid fines. You can recharge your account online, via the mobile app, by phone, or at most gas stations.

Important: AutoExpreso is not interoperable with other systems like E-ZPass from the mainland US.
