NEW PARENT SUPPORT PROGRAM (NPSP)



We welcome expectant parents and parents of children from birth to three years of age who are active-duty Service members, Army Reserve and Army National Guard members who are on active duty for 30 days or more, and to Family members who are assigned, attached, and reside on the Fort Buchanan installation.

The NPSP provides hospital and home visits, morning playgroups, and educational and prevention services, including parenting classes, baby sign

language, and more.

Information and referrals to military and civilian programs that support parents of infants and young children are also available. All services and activities provided through the NPSP are voluntary and non-stigmatizing and emphasizing the parent's strengths
