

WHAT IS THE NEW PARENT SUPPORT PROGRAM?

The New Parent Support Program (NPSP) provides educational and prevention services to eligible Families with children prenatal to 3 years old whether they live on or off the installation. Activities and services provided include information and referral to military and civilian programs that support parents of infants and young children, such as parenting programs and morning playgroups for children. All activities and services provided through NPSP are voluntary and non-stigmatizing and emphasize the parent's strengths.



Goals of NPSP

- 1. Contribute to mission readiness.
- 2. Support Family member adaptation to military life.
- 3. Enhance the knowledge and skills Family members need to form healthy relationships and provide safe, nurturing environments for children to prevent Family violence.
- 4. Foster a supportive military community for young military families.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Expectant parents and parents of children from birth to three years of age who are active duty service members, Army Reserve, and Army National Guard members who are on active duty for 30 days or more and to Family members who are assigned, attached, and reside on the Fort Buchanan installation.

PLAY GROUPS

Play groups enhance parent-child interactions and stimulate child growth and development. Registration is required.

REALISTIC EXPECTATIONS CLASS

The weekly Realistic Expectations class focuses on a specific stage of development and addresses the milestones and/or concerns that parents may have, as well as provides useful tips for parents of children in each stage.
